## Joint initiatives

## **Roverway concept review**

The Roverway concept review was conducted by the Joint Work teams of the European Scout Region and the Europe Region WAGGGS in 2024. In October 2024, a <u>set of recommendations</u> was given to the Joint Committee. Following analysis, the necessary changes were introduced, and the new <u>Roverway Guidelines</u> were launched in January 2025.

## **Azimuth online platform**

In the 2022-2025 Triennium, the Azimuth platform was managed by a Joint team comprised of 4 members and 1 team lead, supported by the Joint Work Portfolio Holders in the European Scout Committee and Europe Region WAGGGS Committee and one staff support from WSB- Europe Support Centre.

The team had a communications strategy, provided technical management and development of the platform, increased the number of users by 168%, delivered workshops at events, webinars and online trainings and managed requests from Member Organizations.

The team also had two in-person meetings in 2023 and 2024, provided statistics on the platform's performance, and regularly reported to the Joint Committee.

#### **External Representatives**

The external representatives have collaborated at events where both WOSM and WAGGGS were present, whenever possible, especially in the context of the European Youth Forum, EU Youth Dialogue, and the European Scout and Guide Call for Action for the European Elections 2024.

#### Collaboration between other teams

Due to our regions working on a few common topics, there were occasional exchanges between teams working on mental health, sustainability and crisis management at the regional level, especially in preparation for workshops and sessions for joint events.

#### **Joint Communications**

In 2024, the Joint Committee approved a framework for joint communications to support planning teams of Joint Events and staff and volunteers in charge of communications in WOSM and WAGGGS.

## **Joint Work teams**

Both WOSM and WAGGGS each set up a team focussing on Joint Work which conducted together the Roverway concept review and an internal review of the joint working methods, to support the future committee members on ways of improvement of Joint Work.

#### **Good Governance**

To increase understanding, alignment, and collaboration between the two organisations, each of the Joint Work Portfolio Holders participated in the first meeting of all regional volunteers of the other organisation for the Triennium. This allowed them to observe similarities and differences and spot opportunities and challenges for collaboration in that Triennium.

Moreover, the two committees maintained the practice of having their March meeting simultaneously in the same location. They used the opportunity to meet with local and national leadership in hosting countries, have moments of team-building, receive regular reports from volunteer teams, staff, and hosts, respond to situations of crisis, and choose the hosts of future joint events. As regulated by the MoU, the coordination group managed the relationship and planned all meetings.

More details on the Joint Work achieved in the 2022-2025 Triennium will be presented during the Joint Conference 2025.
