

# Document 15 Record of Decisions

September 2025



# **INTRODUCTION**

This document sets out the narrative summary of the discussions, and the Record of Decisions voted on by Member Organisations, at the 18th European Guide Conference held from July 20th to July 23rd 2025 in Austria.

### **RULES OF PROCEDURE**

The Rules of Procedure used in the Regional Conference were those approved by Member Organisations at the 38th World Conference in July 2023.

# **QUORUM**

During the Opening Business session of the Regional Conference, the Regional Chair confirmed that the conference was quorate, and this remained the case across all voting sessions.

A count of Member Organisations present was taken at the start of each voting session during the conference. The count was conducted by the Tellers through the voting platform.

### SUMMARY OF DISCUSSIONS

The Programme and Agenda for the Regional Conference (Document 10C) can be found here.

In the Session "18th European Guide Conference Opening Session", the Regional Committee presented the Triennial Regional Report for the 2022-2025 triennium, Also in this session, Anais from Mouvement Scout de Suisse raised points regarding the Rules of Procedure, noting areas that could benefit from clarification.

In the Session "Conference Documents Discussion", the Regional Committee presented the Triennial Regional Action Plan for the 2026-2028 triennium. Eefje Smeulders from Scouting Nederland thanked the committee, the WAGGGS Europe team, and contributors to the Action Plan. She requested further clarity regarding the decision to lower financial reserves, acknowledging that current savings are being used to cover funding gaps but emphasizing the importance of planning for future trienniums to ensure financial sustainability. Teo from Scouterna, Sweden, highlighted the value of the proposed Compass Camp event, noting the importance of flexible hosting arrangements depending on the Member Organisation.

In this Session the Proposed Motions and Proposed Amendments were also discussed. The rationales for the Proposed Motions and the Proposed Amendments can be found in <u>Document 7G: Proposed Motions and Proposed Amendments:</u>

In total 10 Member Organisations spoke during the discussion. Of those speaking, at least 8 out of 14 were young women under the age of thirty at the time of the conference.

During the discussion, the following points were raised and have been summarised:

### Motion 2 - Triennial Action Plan:

- O Broad support for improved governance, transparency, and democratic processes.
- O Questions raised around practical impact on daily operations.

# • Motion 3 - Compass Camp:

- O Discussed inclusivity and ensuring all MOs can participate effectively in joint work.
- ${\tt O} \quad {\tt Recognised \ value \ in \ addressing \ a \ gap \ within \ WAGGGS; \ strong \ support \ for \ feasibility \ work. }$
- O Emphasis on inclusivity, flexibility in hosting, and not finalising arrangements too early.

# • Motion 4 - Evaluation of the European Guide Conference:

- O Desire for in-person elements alongside digital, though amendment not passed.
- O Commitment to evaluating 2025 conferences, including financial review and feedback tools.

# Motion 5 – Future of Joint Work

- O General support for alignment and joint work, provided MO involvement is safeguarded.
- O Emphasis on realistic, feasible approaches to collaboration.

### Motion 6 – Azimuth Platform

- O Concerns over platform's usefulness, cost, and lack of support.
- O Recognition of potential for fostering connections but preference for safer, updated solutions.

# • Motion 7 – European Contribution Policy Principles

- O Support for revised model with greater transparency and robust evaluation.
- O Commitment expressed to contribute in the next triennium.

# Motion 8 – European Contribution Calculation Method

O Mixed views: some support status quo for clarity, others raised concerns over fairness and financial realities.

# Motion 9 –Reflecting our local communities

- O Strong support, with inclusion highlighted as a core principle that benefits every girl and strengthens the movement.
- O Emphasis on diversity, clarity, and flexibility within the triennial action plan.
- O Noted that responsibility should be shared with local committees, which must be actively involved and supported.

# Motion 10 – Linguistic Diversity

- O Broad support for promoting linguistic diversity, framed as a statement of encouragement rather than enforcement.
- Recognition of related international dates, past motions, and platform limitations; emphasis on small, incremental steps within the committee's mandate.

# Motion 11 – Sustainable and conscious catering

- O Support for considering environmental impacts but concerns over resourcing and control.
- O Preference for guidance on sustainable planning rather than strict evaluation.

# Motion 12 – Roverway Host Selection

- O Strong support for making hosting more accessible, with emphasis on fairness, transparency, and an ethical decision-making process.
- O Concerns raised about potential disadvantages for smaller MOs and whether voting would achieve the motion's aims; preference for a content-based selection process.
- O Proposal for a working group to develop a fairer host selection framework, while noting that final responsibility remains with the committee.
